**ASTORIA, OR** – Astoria Sunday Market offers fresh and locally grown music from the Pacific Northwest to its music stage each week starting Mother’s Day, May 10. At the Market audiences get a hearty, heaping helpin’ of great music dished out each Sunday through October 11. “We’re excited about the incredible talent available in the region and look forward to introducing some new voices into our seasonal line-up,” said Cyndi Mudge, Market Director.

The Market opens Mother’s Day, May 10, with **The Swing Cats** and the season wouldn’t be complete without performances by **The Brownsmead Flats**, playing July 5 and again on August 30. Other coastal favorites are also returning to the music stage, including the **Bond Street Blues Band**, **Floating Glass Balls**, **StormTrain**, **Columbia Crew**, **Jackson Andrews**, **The Salty Dogs**, and **Greg Parke**. Local bands new to the Music Stage this year are **Buoy 10** and **The Distractions**.

Regional bands coming to perform this season provide an eclectic mix of Americana, blues, jazz, funk and folk. From Tacoma, the stage features the wildly original foot-stomping “swampabilly” sound of **Junkyard Jane** and the original blues stylings of **Trevalyan Blue**. From the Portland area the stage features **Caravan Gogh** –an entertaining and exotic brew of gypsy, rock, swing, funk, and jazz with Jim D’Ville; **The Cowboy Heroes** with their mix of country Americana and roots rock; **RaChiChi** – giving us a pop-jazz treat for the soul; and blues artist **John Twist**.
